Dorchester, MA – December 1, 2008 – Harbor Health Services, Inc., one of the largest community health agencies in the State of Massachusetts, announced today that Lou Brady has joined the agency as the Executive Director of Geiger Gibson Community Health Center.

Mr. Brady has 16 years of experience in community health and ambulatory settings. Most recently, he served as the Site Director of Community Health Center, Inc. (CHC Inc.), a Federally Qualified Health Center in Meriden, CT, operating in 12 cities and serving 70,000 residents. Mr. Brady is credited with integration of behavioral health services in primary care and expansion of behavior health and dental services to underserved children and youth. Prior to joining CHC Inc., he served as the Chief Operating Officer of the Lowell Community Health Center, where he was responsible for the planning, construction and initial operations of Metta Health Center, among other sites, specifically designed to address health care disparities among the local Southeast Asian population, featuring integration of Eastern and Western treatment modalities. Earlier in his career, he worked at the Jewish Memorial Hospital and Beth Israel Hospital.

Mr. Brady holds a Masters in Business Administration from Northeastern University.
